



ARIZONA TO RECOGNIZE LICENSES FROM OTHER STATES

Governor Ducey signed HB 2569 into law on April 10, 2019. This new legislation will allow anyone (physician, physician assistant) with an out of state license in good standing for at least one year to obtain an equivalent license in Arizona. *This new law will be effective 90 days after the Legislature adjourns.*

The application process for those seeking licensure under HB 2569 will not require the production of primary source credentials. In order to be eligible, an applicant may not have had a license revoked or voluntarily surrendered while under investigation for unprofessional conduct. Prior disciplinary action against a license will not disqualify the applicant for licensure if the Board finds the cause for the action has been corrected and resolved. An applicant who has a pending investigation in another state will have the application suspended until the matter is resolved.
