

Pesticides Illness Reporting Guidance

For Health Care Professionals



Mandatory Reporting

Arizona regulation (A.A.C. R-9-4-202) requires that health care professionals submit a report of diagnosed or suspected cases of pesticide related illness to the Arizona Department of Health Services



What are pesticides?

 Any substance (or mixture) that intends to control, destroy, repel, or attract a pest. Pest can be insects, mice or other animals, unwanted plants (weeds), fungi, bacteria or viruses. Examples are disinfectants, sanitizers, plant regulators, insecticides, rodenticides, and fungicides.



Who is required to report?

• Arizona laws and regulations require physicians, licensed health care providers, and poison control center report any **known or suspected** cases of pesticide-related illness or injury.



When should I report?

days.

- Report pesticide-related hospitalizations, death, or cluster cases within 1 day;
- Report all other suspected or confirmed pesticide related illness within 5

What must be reported?

- Patient information: name, gender, contact, race
- Exposure information: occupation, product name, exposure date
- Medical information: symptoms, diagnosis date
- Treatment information: specimen, testing, provider contact

How to report?

- Call the Arizona Poison Control Centers (PCC) at *1-800-222-1222*. PCC can collect required information and provides guidance on pesticide toxicology & medical management

Why to report?

- Satisfy requirements of Arizona law
- Help provide information on the effects and consequences of exposure to the pesticides
- Help identify high risk pesticide and use practices
- Help identify the magnitude and distribution of pesticide-related illness and injury
- Helps identify target populations for intervention and prevention activities to reduce the occurrence of pesticide poisoning

Confidentiality

- Reporting of pesticide-related illness does not violate HIPAA or state laws
- Patients' information is confidential and are not released without consent
- Only aggregate information is provided to the public
