1. CALL TO ORDER

Dr. Douglas Cunningham, Board President, called the meeting to order at 8:05 a.m. and read the Board's mission statement: "The mission of the Board is to protect the public by setting educational and training standards for licensure, and by reviewing complaints made against osteopathic physicians, interns, and residents to ensure that their conduct meets the standards of the profession, as defined in law (A.R.S. § 32-1854)."

2. ROLL CALL AND REVIEW OF AGENDA

The Executive Director took the Roll. Six (6) board members were present, establishing quorum for the meeting. The Executive Director reviewed the agenda.

3. CALL TO THE PUBLIC

- B.** The Board's custom is to ask members of the public to speak when the agenda item of interest to the person is called. Members of the public who wanted to address the Board on an issue not on the agenda were invited to speak prior to the adjournment.

4. REVIEW, CONSIDERATION AND APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Respondent was present with attorney Stephen Myers was sworn in by the court reporter. At the request of the Board, the Respondent stated his education and training. The Investigator reviewed the case. The case was opened after a self-report of an alcohol-related arrest and conviction for assault/domestic violence and disorderly conduct. Mr. Myers made a statement to the Board and informed the Board the Respondent is facing 30 days incarceration and will undergo court-ordered domestic violence counseling. The Respondent answered the Board's questions and expressed his remorse for his actions.

The Respondent continued to answer the Board's questions.

Dr. Cunningham moved to enter Executive Session to review records and receive testimony regarding records which are confidential by statute. Mr. Landau seconded. The Board entered Executive Session with Respondent and his attorney at 1:43 p.m. and returned to Open Session at 1:54 p.m.

The Respondent's ex-wife was present telephonically and was sworn in by the court reporter. His ex-wife detailed a history of alcohol abuse and domestic violence, some of which Dr. Harvey denied.

Dr. Reiss moved to enter Executive Session to obtain legal advice. Dr. Spiekerman seconded. The Board entered Executive Session at 2:07 p.m. and returned to Open Session at 2:16 p.m.

The Board expressed concern about the Respondent's history of violence against women and alcohol abuse and lack of a safety net even though he has stopped drinking. The Board felt that there were multiple issues going on, although there was considerable denial from the Respondent and stated a comprehensive evaluation including a practice, psychological and physical exam was indicated.

MOTION: Dr. Reiss moved for an **Interim Order** to require the Respondent to undergo a comprehensive evaluation by PACE or CPEP to include a substance abuse evaluation, a psychiatric evaluation, a physical exam, psychological evaluation, and a neuro-psychological exam to determine what the best course of treatment should be. Respondent shall continue under the terms of the current requirement. Appointments must be made in the next 90 days, the exams completed and reports to be received by the Board in six months. If there is an issue due to the incarceration, the order may be amended at a future date. Dr. Maitem seconded.

VOICE VOTE: The motion carried unanimously.

H. Shelly Batra, DO

Case No. DO-17-0002A

License No. 005268

The Respondent was present with attorney Victoria Stazio and was sworn in by the court reporter. At the request of the Board, the Respondent stated her education and training. The Medical Consultant reviewed the outside medical consultant's review. The complaint alleged failure to diagnose and treat a pediatric patient, resulting in a colon resection. 9. REVIEW, CONSIDERATION AND ACTION ON MOTION TO DEEM ALLEGATIONS ADMITTED

A. William Willis, DO Case No. DO-15-0232A License No. 4742

The Respondent was present telephonically. Michael Raine, Assistant Attorney General, was present to represent the Board. Jeanne Galvin, Assistant Attorney General, was present to represent the State of Arizona.

The Respondent gave a statement apologizing and admitting responsibility. The Respondent answered the Board’s questions about his current state of licenses, practice and CME. His Kentucky and West Virginia licenses expired while under Suspension and he has not practiced medicine in almost two years. During the September meeting, the Board moved to deem the allegations admitted, adopted the finding of facts and conclusions of law, but deferred action until the Respondent could be present. Ms. Galvin stated that the Respondent has demonstrated that he is unable to be regulated and failed to report criminal charges to the Board. The Investigator reported that the criminal charges had been dismissed. The Board expressed a desire to give the Respondent opportunity to be rehabilitated and his ability to practice assessed.

MOTION: Mr. Landau moved for **Revocation**, but agreed to **Stay the Revocation** and impose a two-year **Suspension**. Before the Suspension is lifted, conditions must be met including an evaluation by an approved psychiatrist, full physical exam by an approved physician, and full practice assessment at a location approved by the Executive Director. All exams to be at the cost of the Respondent, must be scheduled within 12 months, completed and reported to this Board within 18 months, and an in-person appearance before the Board before expiration of this Order. If conditions are not met, the license will automatically be revoked. Dr. Reiss seconded.

A. Report on ED Dismissed Complaints

Ms. Jones provided a written report to the Board, stating there were 27 cases which were ED dismissed from September 12, 2017 to October 6, 2017. A total of 37 cases were resolved during that same time period, with an average of 193 days to resolve.

Ms. Jones reported there were 9 cases ready for the three reviewer process, 11 cases pending Investigative Hearing, 14 cases on October's agenda, and 11 cases were resolved today on the Committee agendas.

She presented further statutorily required information in her written report.

C. Executive Director Report

Ms. Jones provided a written report to the Board.

2. Summary of Current Events that Affect the Board

None were discussed.

3. Legislation update

No update was provided.

D. Board may review, discuss and take action on additional information regarding Jerry Olshan, DO.

Dr. Olshan was not present. Ms. Jones reported that 43 whole and un-redacted medical records from Dr. Olshan were found in a dumpster behind an individual's house. Ms. Jones asked if the Board wanted to add this possible violation to the current case for Revocation. The Board directed Ms. Jones to determine if Dr. Huang, who also had files in the dumpster, is an MD or DO and to report it to the proper Board.

MOTION: Dr. Reiss moved to add this violation to the case for Revocation. Mr. Spiekerman seconded.

VOICE VOTE: The motion carried unanimously.

E. Board may review, discuss and take action on notification when Interstate Medical Licensure Compact expedited license applicants do not qualify to have Arizona as their State of Principle Licensure.

Ms. Jones reported she will draft a policy for the Board's consideration.

F. Board may review, discuss and take action on request for Retired Status from Douglas Bobb, DO

Dr. Bobb was not present. Ms. Jones reviewed the Retired Status request.

MOTION: Dr. Cunningham moved to approve the Retired Status request. Dr. Reiss seconded.

VOICE VOTE: The motion carried unanimously.
